Legislative Action

Since November, I have introduced six pieces of legislation and co-sponsored more than 85 others.

STEM Prep Act: Creates a pipeline of qualified workers to fill the skills gap that exists for STEM jobs that don't require a four-year degree.

Greensboro Four Resolution: Recognizes the contribution of the Greensboro Four to the revitalization of the civil rights movement and to honor them as leaders.

American Civil Rights Cities Act: Directs the National Park Service to designate at least one city in the United States each year as an "American Civil Rights City" based on the city's contributions to protect civil rights history through museums and recognition of civil rights leaders.

Women's History Month Resolution: Recognizes women who have made great strides in improving the pathway to education for women in America, and acknowledges their contributions to advancing women's rights.



Medical Device Tax Elimination Act: Eliminates the medical device tax included in the Affordable Care Act (ACA) while keeping healthcare subsidies intact.

Veterans Benefits Network Act: Authorizes use of discretionary federal funding for public-private partnerships that better connect veterans to services and resources in their communities.
