2018 Employee Climate Survey Now Available

The 2018 Employee Climate Survey (ECS) is now available and will be open to County employees until Monday, April 30.

Our theme this year is "Employee Insights: Moving the County from Vision to Action," and we are aiming for 100 percent participation. The ECS is a useful tool to gather data and gain insight regarding employee perceptions and opinions related to their work experience. In order to improve, we must commit to a constant process of internal review and analysis.

More than 72 percent of the organization (3,694 employees) responded to the 2017 Climate Survey.

Students resurrect and refashion aluminum, paper, cardboard, plastics, and other materials that they normally would place in their recycling containers into incredibly creative and beautiful fashions that they display and model at the show. By participating in this event, students and administrators are reminded of the importance of recycling in homes and schools throughout our community.

This year, participants will compete for over \$18,000 in cash prizes. Cash prizes were made possible thanks to the generosity of over 17 sponsoring organizations.

Last month, Charlotte-Mecklenburg Storm Water Services held the Big Spring Clean stream clean up event at 10 locations throughout the County.

During the 4-hour event, 336 volunteers removed 9.24 tons of trash and cleaned over 22 miles of shoreline and streams. Crews were able to recycle 1.8 tons of the items collected.
