A Holiday to Honor Our Heroes

Next Monday, Nov. 12, Mecklenburg County government offices and agencies will be closed in observance of Veterans Day. This is an opportunity to honor the men and women who have served our country in the armed forces.

Currently, there are more than 50,000 veterans that call Mecklenburg County home. I would like to salute each of them and thank County employees for the outstanding work they are doing to help veterans get the services they need and transition back into civilian life and the workforce.

Our Veteran Services Division, the largest in the state, is staffed with 11 nationally accredited officers who prepare, present and prosecute claims on behalf of the veterans to the Department of Veterans Affairs. In FY2018, the division saw 13,108 veterans and their family members and filed 3,720 new claims.

The [Veterans Services Division](#) is also a leading partner in the Housing Our Heroes initiative. Since its inception, the division has helped 679 formerly homeless veterans find housing.

Our [Code Enforcement Department](#), in partnership with CPCC, is underway with the Building With Our Veterans Apprenticeship program. Currently, there are three people enrolled in the program
