Community Support Services Hosts UNC Chapel Hill's Violence Prevention Alternative Winter Break

Last month, [Community Support Services](#) (CSS) served as host to eight students from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill as part of their [APPLES Service-Learning Violence Prevention Alternative Winter Break](#). During the visit, the students toured the Supervised Visitation and Safe Exchange Center, the New Options for Violent Actions facility, and learned about CSS Prevention and Intervention domestic violence services.

APPLES Service-Learning is a student-led program that transforms educational experiences by connecting academic learning and public service. During the break experience, students apply what they are learning about the focus areas and communities at different sites through direct and indirect service as well as advocacy work. At the beginning of the spring semester, after students return to campus, participants attend a reorientation program to share experiences across breaks and consider ways to build on lessons learned.
