DON'T LET LEAD-BASED PAINT POISON YOUR FAMILY

LEAD SAFE CHARLOTTE, Lead Hazard Control Program

Did You Know? If you live in a house built before 1978 you and any children under six who live in or regularly visit your house could be at risk for lead poisoning.

Did You Know? Those walls inside or outside homes built before 1978 that have peeling paint, chipping paint, or paint that has water damage, can put a child who is under the age of six in even greater danger.

Did You Know? You should have children under six who live in units built before 1978 tested for lead poisoning.

Did You Know? The City of Charlotte has a free program that can help you reduce or eliminate lead hazards in your home. If you meet the income and location requirements, you may be eligible for new, free windows, doors, free interior or exterior painting, or other free work done to areas that contain a lead hazard. This program is open to owner occupied and rental units, however, applications are accepted from property owners only.
