Bond Highlights

At Charlotte-Mecklenburg Schools, we strive to provide our students, families and community with high-quality schools that inspire learning and prepare students for success in college and the 21st-century workplace. On Nov. 5, Mecklenburg County residents will vote on a \$290 million bond referendum for CMS. The 17 projects in the bond request address CMS' highest-need capital projects and deliver three significant benefits.







More academic options for students

Many projects will increase access to high-demand programs and magnets that prepare today's students for tomorrow's workforce

- Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts and Mathematics (STEAM)
- Language Immersion
- Career and Technical Education programs

Relieve overcrowding

Several projects provide new schools and additions to accommodate student growth and reduce the need for mobile classrooms.

- Two new K-8 magnet schools
- One new PreK-8 school
- Repurposing of two facilities as schools
- Numerous classroom additions

Facility renovations and replacements

With 78 of our 160 schools built more than 50 years ago, the need for major renovations and replacement schools is urgent to maintain safe, healthy learning environments for students and staff.

- Three replacement schools*
- Numerous renovations and upgrades

* Replacement schools are new construction schools that replace an existing school
