
FOR VCMS VCPCC Education Bonds

Bond Referenda on November 5

- \$290 million for Charlotte-Mecklenburg Schools (CMS): 17 projects that will relieve overcrowding, offer more academic options for students, and renovate, replace and improve existing facilities.
- **√** \$210 million for Central Piedmont Community College (CPCC): 10 projects that will expand and modernize its facilities, provide technical training space, and add instructional classrooms and labs.

CMS

I.M. Alexander Middle School

- Replacement school on the current J.M. Alexander Middle School site; the project cost also includes the demolition of the existing school.
- Expand capacity for International Baccalaureate magnet program.

North Mecklenburg High School

• First phase to enhance Career and Technical Education offerings including automotive, carpentry, culinary, cosmetology and horticulture.

Davidson K-8

· Convert the current Davidson Elementary School to a Kindergarten – 8th grade facility. This will provide relief to Bailey Middle School and continuity to the families currently in the Davidson Elementary School boundary.

CPCC

Merancas Campus, Huntersville

• The purchase of land and construction of 100,000 additional square-feet of instructional space.

DISTRICT 2

CMS

Olympic High School

- Construction of additional classroom space will increase the school capacity.
- Update and renovate the auditorium.

Northwest School of the Arts

- · Complete renovation of the auditorium, making it performance-worthy and more accessible.
- Comprehensive renovation of a multi-story classroom building.

Nations Ford Elementary School

 Replacement school on the current E.E. Waddell Academy of International Languages campus, which is within the existing Nations Ford attendance boundary.

Ashley Park/Bruns Avenue/Walter G. Byers/ Reid Park/Westerly Hills Academies

- Second phase of conversions of each of these former elementary schools to Pre-Kindergarten – 8th grade facilities.
- Upgrades to the core facilities including gymnasium, cafeteria, exploratory and arts classrooms, and technology classrooms.

West Mecklenburg High School

 First phase to enhance Career and Technical Education offerings including automotive, carpentry, culinary, cosmetology and horticulture.

New Pre-Kindergarten – 8th Grade School

 Provide relief for Berryhill School and Reid Park Academy.

CPCC

Harper Campus

 Project will add 150,000 square-feet of instructional space, including room for another CPCC-CMS middle college.

DISTRICT 3

CMS

Druid Hills Academy

- Second phase of conversion of former elementary school to Pre-Kindergarten – 8th grade facility.
- Addition of gymnasium and specialty classrooms, and expansion for the dining room.

Garinger High School

 First phase to enhance Career and Technical Education offerings including automotive, carpentry, culinary, cosmetology and horticulture.

Statesville Road Elementary School

 Replacement school most likely built at a nearby site.

Northridge Middle School

• Addition of a 14-classroom building.

CPCC

Cato Campus

 Adding 100,000 square-feet of instructional space at CPCC's most crowded campus.

DISTRICT 4

CMS

Oakhurst Elementary School

 Repurpose current facility to serve as a full STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts and Mathematics) magnet program.

New Language Immersion Pre-Kindergarten – 8th Grade

- New magnet school to provide relief for Albemarle Road elementary and middle schools, and other adjacent elementary schools (exact location of school TBD).
- A language-immersion program to further regionalize the offering and address the wait pool at Collinswood K-8.

East Mecklenburg High School

• Addition of a multi-story 30-classroom building.

CPCC

Central Campus

- Purchase of land and construction of 100,000 additional square-feet of space for advanced manufacturing training.
- Renovate Giles Science Building to provide biology and chemistry labs.
- Build new basic skills literacy center, 200,000 square-foot facility to help adult students gain basic skills needed for the workplace.
- Renovate and expand Terrell Hall. Work will include making the building more energy efficient.
- Renovate and expand Advanced
 Technology Center for advanced
 manufacturing and machining programs.

DISTRICT 5

CMS

Starmount Elementary School

 Restore elementary school, providing relief for Huntingtowne Farms and Montclaire elementary schools.

Myers Park High School

 Replace three classroom buildings and renovate cafeteria.

South Mecklenburg High School

 Replace the two oldest buildings on the campus with 30-classroom building and renovate cafeteria.

Selwyn Elementary School

 Renovate classroom building and expand parking and play areas.

DISTRICT 6

CMS

Independence High School

 First phase to enhance Career and Technical Education offerings including automotive, carpentry, culinary, cosmetology and horticulture.

New Kindergarten – 8th Grade STEAM Magnet

 New STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts and Mathematics) magnet program will provide relief for Community House and Jay M. Robinson middle schools as well as the elementary schools that feed them (exact location of school TBD).

CPCC

Levine Campus, Matthews

- The purchase of land and the construction of 120,000 additional square-feet of instructional space. Project will include space for a CPCC-CMS middle college.
- Expand Hendrick Automotive Building for student training and industry continuing education.

No tax rate increase related to the bond vote.
