### **Governor McCrory reveals 25-year transportation vision for NC**

Governor McCrory and NCDOT Secretary Tony Tata embarked on a statewide tour last Wednesday to announce their 25-year transportation vision for North Carolina. The governor and Secretary Tata visited Wilmington, Greenville, Winston-Salem, Asheville, Fayetteville, Concord and Raleigh to reveal their plans to overhaul transportation methods in each region. The strategies announced by the governor and Secretary Tata will ensure the economic prosperity of North Carolina by facilitating the movement of goods and services and creating jobs.



"Transportation is the backbone of our state's economy, and investing in transportation solutions will help expand opportunities and create jobs," Governor McCrory said. "Companies want to invest where they know there is a strong vision for moving people and products and that is why we have made this strategic vision a priority."

Governor Pat McCrory and North Carolina Commerce Secretary Sharon Decker announced last Wednesday that HCL Technologies Ltd (HCL), a leading global IT services provider will be expanding its presence in Wake County. ## ***Governor meets with Military Affairs Commission at Cherry Point***

Governor McCrory met with the Military Affairs Commission at Marine Corps Air Station Cherry Point on Tuesday to hear from members and local officials about the status of the state's military installations, the Reserves and the National Guard. The governor also addressed the group, reminding them of his commitment to supporting and strengthening the state's military presence and personnel.

"North Carolina has always played a pivotal role in our nation's defense, and I will not only continue that tradition, but work hard to enhance it," Governor McCrory said.

Speaking about recent legislative accomplishments, the governor mentioned signing into law a bill creating the equivalent of in-state tuition for veterans at our state's community colleges and universities. He also discussed legislation he signed that provides college credit for military experience, as well as for professional licensing and certification.

## ***Governor McCrory Makes Passing a Cell Phone to a Prisoner a Felony***

Giving a prisoner a cell phone is now a felony under legislation signed into law last week by Governor McCrory. Previously, the offense was a misdemeanor. The North Carolina Conference of District Attorneys praised the increased penalty in the wake of a kidnapping case which was directed by an incarcerated prisoner through communications sent by a cell phone.

Among those attending Thursday's bill signing was Wake County Assistant District Attorney Colleen Janssen, whose father was kidnapped earlier this year.



"We must do everything we can to protect those in the criminal justice system who protect us," Governor McCrory said. "The state's District Attorneys provided valuable guidance and support for this legislation, and North Carolina will be safer because of their efforts and those in the General Assembly who crafted and passed this bill."

House Bill 369 makes numerous changes to the state's criminal code, including increasing the penalty against those who assault or threaten a person who is carrying out their professional duties. The new law also streamlines firearm safety measures, increases penalties for those with multiple concealed firearm offenses and directs the Human Trafficking Commission to study the prevention of sexual abuse of children.
