Voter Information

When is the vote?

The general election is November 4, 2014.

When is the deadline to register to vote?

The deadline to register for the general election is October 10, 2014.

How can I register to vote?

To register, pick up a form at any branch of the Charlotte Mecklenburg library or at the Mecklenburg County Board of Elections office (741 Kenilworth Ave., Suite 202). You can also visit the Board of Elections website (www.meckboe.org) to download a copy of the registration application. To register, you must be a U.S. citizen, a resident of North Carolina and Mecklenburg County for 30 days, and at least 18 years old.

Can I vote early?

Yes. Early voting begins Oct. 23, 2014, and ends Nov. 1, 2014, at 1 p.m. There will be 21 early voting sites. Please check the Mecklenburg County Board of Elections website (www.meckboe.org) for locations and hours of operations.

Absentee voting

Citizens may print an absentee-voting application from the Mecklenburg County Board of Elections website (www.meckboe.org) and mail or fax (704-343-0537) it to the Board of Elections. The address is 741 Kenilworth Ave., Suite 202, Charlotte, NC 28204.

Absentee ballots will be mailed starting Friday, Sept. 5, 2014. The deadline for requesting an absentee ballot by mail is Oct. 28, 2014. Absentee ballots must be returned in person by 5 p.m. on Monday, Nov. 3, 2014. Mailed absentee ballots must be postmarked by Tuesday, Nov. 4, 2014.
