

#### City of Charlotte Bond Referenda on November 4 Ballot:



\$110.96 million for streets: Fund street and intersection projects, upgrades to traffic control system, repairs to and replacements of bridges, construction of new bridges, initial development of Cross Charlotte Multi-Use Trail and measures to improve pedestrian safety.



\$15 million for housing: Provide affordable and wellmaintained housing for low- and moderate-income individuals and families that addresses a continuum of housing needs – from homelessness to homeownership.



\$20 million for neighborhoods: Improve infrastructure - such as sidewalks, streetscape, curbs and gutters, storm drainage, landscaping and pedestrian lighting – in the city's older neighborhoods and emerging high-growth areas.



This November, there will be three referenda on the general election ballot that ask voters in the city of Charlotte for approval to issue bonds worth \$145.9 million.

## **STREETS**TOTAL \$110,964,000



- East/Southeast Corridor (\$12.5M) land acquisition and street connections surrounding the redevelopment of Bojangles' Coliseum/Ovens Auditorium
- Northeast Corridor (\$47.2M)
  - Research Drive to J.W. Clay Boulevard connector over I-85 (north bridge): planning and design of bridge
  - IBM Drive to Ikea and University Pointe boulevards connector over I-85 (south bridge): construction of bridge
  - Northeast Corridor Infrastructure (NECI)
  - Applied Innovation Corridor: Streetscape along Graham Street and Matheson Avenue, Woodward/24th Street connection and Tryon Street connectivity
- Road Infrastructure Projects (\$17.2M): Neighborhood transportation programs and construction and infrastructure surrounding the Eastern Circumferential (from Hanberry Boulevard to Back Creek Church Road).
- Cross Charlotte Multi-Use Trail (\$5M): Planning, design and land acquisition for the 26-mile trail that will connect the county's system of greenways.
- Sidewalks and Pedestrian Safety (\$15M)
- Traffic Control and Bridges (\$14M)
  - Upgrade traffic signal system coordination
  - · Upgrade traffic control devices
  - Replace and repair bridges

## **AFFORDABLE HOUSING** TOTAL \$15,000,000



Bonds on this year's ballot to go to the Charlotte Housing Trust Fund, leveraging private investment dollars, and will provide affordable and well-maintained housing for low- and moderate-income individuals and families in the Charlotte area.

- Multi-family new construction and rehabilitation
- Homeownership development in targeted neighborhoods
- Housing for seniors, disabled and homeless populations
- Acquisition of properties for developing mixedincome communities

## **NEIGHBORHOOD IMPROVEMENT** TOTAL \$20,000,000



Bonds on this year's ballot to fund capital projects and address immediate infrastructure needs in our city's older neighborhoods and emerging high-growth areas.

- Support the Comprehensive Neighborhood Improvement Program (CNIP) to improve our neighborhoods showing signs of distress.
- Link neighborhoods with employment centers, parks, transit and schools.
- Connect streets, sidewalks, trails and bike lanes to enhance existing community assets and provide more mobility/transportation options.
- Leverage investments to maximize public/private partnerships.
