Governor McCrory unveils pilot program designed to match veterans with civilian jobs

After unveiling his 2015-2017 budget proposal in Raleigh on Thursday, Governor McCrory traveled to Camp Lejeune to

announce the NC Military Pipeline, a public-private pilot project aimed at keeping newly separated veterans in North Carolina by matching their military skills and experience to civilian employment, education and training opportunities.

A team of business, education, military and government leaders helped create the NC Military Pipeline pilot program to help convince these new veterans to launch their civilian careers in North Carolina. Governor McCrory said veterans are a boost to the workforce because military training has already equipped them with many of the 21st-century skills North Carolina needs in fields such as information technology, manufacturing, transportation and health care.

Governor Announces New Jobs, Pledges Support for Historic Tax Credits in Edenton

Governor McCrory was in Edenton today to announce that Jimbo's Jumbos, Inc. will expand its operations in Chowan County and create 78 new jobs over the next three years. The company plans to invest \$30 million in the city of Edenton over the same period.



"Peanuts are one of our state's traditional crops, with North Carolina peanuts and peanut products being shipped all over the world for people to enjoy," said Governor McCrory. "North Carolina is one of the top states in the nation in peanut production and exported more than \$12 million in peanuts last year."

Headquartered in Edenton, NC, Jimbo's Jumbos is a manufacturer of peanut products including roasted and salted peanuts in the shell, peanut butter, granulated peanuts, oil roasted and dry roasted peanuts. The company currently has 208 employees in Chowan County. Jimbo's Jumbos is part of the Hampton Farms family of companies.

While the governor was in Edenton, he also toured several historic locations and spoke about the importance of reinstating the Historic Preservation Tax Credit program. Joined by Cultural Resources Secretary Susan Kluttz, the governor spoke to supporters in the 1909 Edenton Peanut Mill and toured several other businesses and houses that have utilized or could use historic tax credits.



Governor McCrory celebrates 100th anniversary of legislation establishing N.C.'s first state park

Governor McCrory signed and issued a proclamation at William B. Umstead State Park in Raleigh on Tuesday celebrating March 3 as the 100th anniversary of legislation authorizing Mount Mitchell as North Carolina's first state park.

"North Carolina's state parks connect us all with our rich natural heritage and our history and contribute significantly to the state's economy, especially in rural areas where many of the parks are located," Governor McCrory said. "This is a premier opportunity to recognize the visionary
