Packrite, LLC expansion to add 100 new jobs in Guilford County

Governor McCrory, N.C. Commerce Secretary John E. Skvarla III and the Economic Development Partnership of N.C. announced Tuesday that Packrite, LLC will expand its operations in Guilford County and create 100 new jobs over the next five years. The company plans to invest \$8.9 million in building and equipment in the city of High Point over the course of the first year.



"Packrite is a home-grown, locally-owned North Carolina company that has a successful history in High Point," said Governor McCrory. "This is a company that was started during a down economy and has grown to be an industry leader in just a few short years."

Packrite was founded in 2008 by Mary and Michael Drummond. By 2012, the company was ranked #205 (#1 in Manufacturing) in Inc. magazine's list of fastest growing 500 privately-owned companies in America. The company manufactures high end fluted graphic packaging and folded paperboard packaging for a variety of uses and products. Packrite currently has 78 employees in Guilford County.


