Farmer's Market - Sow Much Good

Beginning on May 16 and continuing each Saturday this summer and fall, Sow Much Good is holding a farmers market at The Renaissance. With signage advertising the market around the community and along West Boulevard, area residents are becoming familiar with the growing number of opportunities in their neighborhood. Healthcare - Managing Chronic Diseases

This month, several senior residents enrolled in the **Chronic Disease Self- Management Program**, sponsored by the Department of Social Services and the Centralina Area Agency on Aging. The free class meets weekly for 3 hours to cover techniques for living with common chronic illnesses such as diabetes and hypertension. [Learn more here.](#)
