**GANTT CENTER TO HOST 2ND JAZZY HOLIDAY GALA WITH A BIG THEME –
Presented by PNC Bank**

(CHARLOTTE, N.C, October 29, 2015) – The Harvey B. Gantt Center will host its second black-tie Jazzy Holiday Gala affair on Saturday, December 5, beginning at 6pm, at the Charlotte Convention Center, with presenting sponsor PNC Bank.

“Because of the great success of our Jazzy 40th Anniversary Gala, we decided to host another evening event,” said President & CEO David R.
