**From Attorney to Community Advocate -
How The Retreat Found a Voice**

Rosha McGill was one of the first residents to move into The Retreat at Renaissance when it opened in 2013. After receiving her J.D. from Georgetown University, she had a successful legal career advocating for people living in poverty and victims of domestic violence. A series of health problems forced Rosha to close her private practice and continued to interfere

with her ability to maintain employment in the years that followed. Evicted from her apartment because of inability to pay rent, Rosha finally found a home - and a calling - at The Retreat.

When she settled here, she wanted to do something to benefit the mental and physical health of her friends and neighbors. Noting that retired and elderly people often struggle to find purpose in later life, Rosha endeavored to help them find it. Working closely with RWCI Director of Programs Christian Friend, Rosha coordinates exercise classes, book clubs, Bible study, and other social events for the residents. Rosha knows from personal experience that it can be difficult for the elderly to stay motivated and engaged when they are no longer working, so she has dedicated her time to helping her neighbors find passion and purpose. **To read Rosha's full story, [click here](#).**
