





- Expanded Gold Rush shuttle service to JCSU
- Placed B-Cycle station on Beatties Ford Road
- Participated on Streetcar Advisory Committee & Beatties Ford Task Force
- JCSU President is a member of CCCP Board of Directors




Building on Momentum Public Investment

- Gold Line Streetcar
 - \$150 MM investment
 - Extends existing line down Trade Street past JCSU
 - Phase 2 opening 2019
- Parks & greenway network development
- 5th Street & 4th Street, bike & pedestrian improvements

Building on Momentum Public Investment

CNIP Bond Investment Program

- \$20 MM infrastructure investment
- West Trade Rozzelles Ferry
 - Enhance & compliment existing places
 - Create better linkages
 - Improve mobility
- 23 recommended projects

- Opened JCSU Arts Factory
- Developed MOSAIC Village with Griffin family
- Gold Rush shuttle service
- New STEM center at JCSU
- Blue Blaze Brewing Company and Lakewood Trolley
- Residential development



Opportunity to Serve Historic West End




- Northwest Corridor Council of Elders <u>invited</u> Center City Partners to serve as "catalyst organization"
- Knight Foundation granted funding for CCCP to lead initiative for economic & community development
 - \$1.5 million
 - 3 years





- West Trade Street / Beatties
 Ford Road corridor
 from I-77 to Brookshire
 Freeway
- Impact of work will extend beyond identified corridor
- Objective: Collaborate with West End neighborhood & business leaders to develop "neighborhood center"

Historic West End Initiative Deliverables



- Recruit business & retail to the corridor
- Advocate for diverse housing & transportation options & enhanced quality of life
- Research issues & opportunities
- Provide analysis to inform potential investment





- Support community events
- Marketing and promotional efforts
- Invest in targeted infrastructure like street furniture and plantings

Deliverables will be organized in implementation plan to be developed this fall with community input

VISION:

The Historic West End will become a vibrant, prosperous, diverse and inclusive neighborhood center that respects its unique role as the center of Charlotte's African-American community.

Public Realm Make the West Trade corridor more attractive and walkable through a variety of public realm improvements that include sidewalks, streetscape, pedestrian crossings and defining gateways.

Link to Institutions Work with JCSU to advance its vision of becoming a "new urban university" through economic and physical linkages, and reach out to other key institutions including Johnson & Wales and the Midtown Medical District.	Community Gatherings Work with the community to design and produce events that build community, bring neighbors together and celebrate the area's African-American heritage, history and future opportunities.
Local Ownership & Preservation Recruit and assist African American-owned and/or operated businesses and multicultural locally-owned business to the West Trade corridor and balance new investments with the existing neighborhood fabric.	Connectivity Advance transportation and infrastructure initiatives including the CityLYNX Gold Line and greenways that link the West Trade Street corridor to Uptown Charlotte.	Livability Support community efforts to improve public safety, educational opportunities and housing choices.
