Exciting things are happening at Renaissance West Community Initiative! Construction on the new Pre-K - 8 STEAM school will begin later this month, and residents will begin to move into the final phase housing units.

Our year-end reports have shown that since we began care coordination services in May 2015, the incomes of Family Self-Sufficiency (FSS) program participants have increased by an average of 13.7%! We've also seen an increase in career advancement and the number of adults enrolled in some type of continuing education.

Sow Much Good Advocates for Food Security in the Charlotte Region


Sow Much Good works to provide direct access to affordable, nutritious food, educate the public on healthy eating habits, and advocate for the right of every person to have real food security. RWCI has partnered with Sow Much Good to bring these services to residents of The Renaissance. The West Boulevard corridor has limited options for food shopping, and those that do exist are not always easy to access. Lack of transportation or funds makes it difficult for residents to acquire basic healthy foods. Sow Much Good is working to change that by providing seasonal farmers' markets on-site as well as advocating for more permanent solutions to the food security problems West Boulevard corridor residents face.
