Congresswoman Adams met with Charlotte Mayor Jennifer Roberts and Charlotte city officials in Washington, D.C. to discuss federal priorities for the city.



Congresswoman Adams held the first Bipartisan Congressional HBCU Caucus meeting of 2016 with John King, the Acting Secretary of Education. The Caucus expressed their priorities for HBCUs.

Legislative Action

Key Vote: Congresswoman Alma S. Adams voted against legislation to override the President's veto of H.R. 3762. This legislation would undermine critical components of the Affordable Care Act and would defund Planned Parenthood. This is the 63rd vote to repeal or undermine the Affordable Care Act, and the 12th vote to attack women's

health care in the 114th Congress. Shortly before the vote, Congresswoman Adams spoke on the House floor in opposition to the legislation.

Committee Action: On January 12th at a Nutrition Subcommittee hearing, Congresswoman Adams discussed the need for seniors participating in the SNAP program to have a simpler process for documenting their medical bills in order to receive additional SNAP benefits. She also highlighted the need for more job training programs for childless adults who receive SNAP benefits.



Last week, Congresswoman Adams joined other Democratic Colleagues to introduce the *Fair Day in Court for Kids Act* which ensures minors and other vulnerable populations have access to legal representation in immigration proceedings.
