**Dear Friends:**

The time is drawing near! The 2016 election primaries will take place on March 15th. Early voting will begin on March 3rd. A valid photo ID is required to vote in the March primaries. If you are unable to obtain one by the specified deadline, you may vote through the use of a provisional ballot. It requires that you provide: your date of birth and the last four digits of your Social Security number, a document that bears your name and address, or a voter registration card.

The Joint Legislative Education Oversight Committee presented a report by the Public Schools of North Carolina, the State Board of Education, and the Department of Public Instruction concerning the educational effectiveness of charter schools. For the past 20 years, there has been a marked increase in the number of charter schools operating within our state. A recent study analyzed the success of North Carolina's charter programs compared to traditional schools. The study found that charter schools were less diverse and catered to fewer disadvantaged youths than traditional schools. Although a greater number of charter schools deemed well-performing, a comparable number was found to be inadequate in meeting the educational needs of their respective communities.

On February 5th, three federal judges determined that North Carolina's first and twelfth electoral districts were unconstitutionally drawn with racial bias. The 1st Congressional District spreads across northeast North Carolina. The 12th Congressional District runs from Charlotte to Greensboro along Interstate 85.

As a result, on Monday, February 15th, and Tuesday, February 16th, the Joint Select Committee on Congressional Redistricting met to survey public opinion regarding the recent decision of the United States District Court for the Middle District of North Carolina. On February 18th, legislators were called to convene in an extra special session to vote on the new congressional map.



2016 Extra Session

- [2016 Contingent Congressional Plan \(S2 / S.L. 2016-1\)](#) – This legislation realigns the congressional districts to comply with the court order, *Harris v. McCrory*. The House of Representatives and Senate convened into an extra session on Thursday, February 18th to vote on the proposed reconfiguration of North Carolina’s 13 U.S. House districts. The bill passed on February 19, 2016, and is now session law. The federal court will either accept or deny the new maps by March 18.
- [2016 US House of Representatives Primary \(HB 2 / S.L. 2016-2\)](#) – This bill provides that the 2016 U.S. House of Representatives primary election will be held on June 7, 2016. The Governor signed the bill into law on February 23, 2016.

Below is a comparison of the new district map with the old one. Some counties, including Mecklenburg, have been impacted.



“The congressional district map should be drawn in a constitutional manner that fairly represents the voters of North Carolina. Every citizen deserves an equal voice in our democracy. The drawing must demonstrate the best interest of our state and its citizens in a nonpartisan manner,” said Senator Joyce Waddell.


