The Women + Girls Research Alliance (W+GRA) is a unique community-university partnership that identifies and researches issues affecting women and girls in the Charlotte region. We fund research around work and wages, education, civic participation and leadership, health and well-being, and safety and domestic violence. But our work does not end there. The most important part of what we do is to share our work with those organizations, businesses, educational institutions, community leaders, and individuals who can use W+GRA research to develop programs, practices, and policies that change lives for the better.

Our touchstone event is the Summit. The theme for the 2016 W+GRA Summit is Economic Mobility for Women + Girls: From Research to Practice + Policy. In a major study, Charlotte ranked 50th out of 50 U.S. cities in terms of economic mobility—the ability of an individual or family to improve their economic status. A majority of individuals living in poverty are women and children. **2016's Summit will allow W+GRA to share research on wages, education, entrepreneurship, and more in ways that spur dialogue about how best to support the economic mobility of women + girls in our community.**
