



Charlotte-Mecklenburg Schools seeks \$805 million in capital funding to improve schools and increase choice

The mission of Charlotte-Mecklenburg Schools is to maximize academic achievement by every child in every school. To succeed, we need a great teacher in every classroom and a great principal in every school. We also need school buildings that enable innovative teaching and learning environments, support student enrichment activities and promote safe school operations.

We are seeking \$805 million in capital funding to support 29 high-need projects. Here's how the funding would support student achievement and choice:


