Adams 97*2015 US House Score 85*Lifetime NCGA Score

**Special Note – One July 23, 2015 Adams voted against the environment & supported HR 1599, the Safe & Accurate Food Labeling Act, which would deny consumers the right to know what is in their food and how it is grown. HR 1599 would prohibit states from being able to require labeling of genetically modified organisms (GMOs) in food as well as rollback other state laws that help ensure consumers are not misled by inaccurate labeling on foods. The bill is an attack on consumer choice & state efforts to protect human health & the environment. \$4,500 from Duke Energy

Cotham 64*2015 NCGA Score 78*Lifetime NCGA Score

**Special Note – She voted multiple times (SB729-2014) to allow Duke Energy to pass to its customers the costs associated with the coal ash cleanup. \$5,000 from Duke Energy

Cunningham 91*2015 NCGA Score 83*Lifetime NCGA Score

**Special Note – SB 734 – Voted in 2014 to rollback several critical environmental protections for wetlands, stormwater controls & development. \$0 from Duke Energy

Graham 100 *2014 NCGA Score 81*Lifetime NCGA Score

**Special Note – SB 32 – Voted in 2013 for a bill that would cause each and every “permanent” regulatory rule to expire after ten years. Agencies would be required to go through the full elaborate rule-making process annually for every rule set to expire that year. Some rules may even slip through the bureaucratic cracks, causing important regulations to lapse even though the agency agrees they should be in place. This legislation would be a long-game play to eliminate beneficial regulatory structures protecting our water, air, and mountains. \$10,000 from Duke Energy
