If you have participated in one of our Expunction Clinics and provided us your name, birth date and contact phone number, then it is time for you to sit-down with an attorney to complete your process.

What you Need: First time attendees can bring a copy of their criminal record (*obtained from the Mecklenburg County Courthouse Criminal Clerks office*) to see if they're eligible for an expungement.
