Who Should Attend: **If** you are in need of a criminal record expunction you may attend this hands-on Expunction Clinic, as the first phase of getting your criminal record expunged or walk in with criminal record in hand.

If you have participated in one of our Expunction Clinics and provided us your name, birth date and contact phone number, then it is time for you to sit-down with an attorney to complete your process.

What you Need: First time attendees can bring a copy of their criminal record (*obtained from the Mecklenburg County Courthouse Criminal Clerks office*) to see if they're eligible for an expungement.
