Legislative Actions

Legislation Signed into Law

Small and Disadvantaged Business Enhancement Act: Expands oversight over the government purchase card system to better free up the funds allocated to small businesses.

Maya Angelou Memorial Post Office: Designates the Center City Post Office, located in Winston-Salem, to be renamed the Maya Angelou Memorial Post Office.

Legislation Passed in the U.S. House of Representatives

HBCU Capital Financing Improvement Act: Allows HBCUs increased access to federal funding to better respond to localized needs and support their students.

SCORE for Small Business Act: Reauthorizes the SCORE program until 2018 to assist Americans to start and grow their small businesses.

Legislation Introduced

Public Safety and Wildlife Protection Act: Prohibits the interstate shipment of dangerous Leghold and Conibear traps in order to better care for animal and human life.

Closing the Meal Gap Act: Strengthens the SNAP program for families, adults looking for work, seniors and the disabled.

HBCU Innovation Fund Act: Provides grants to HBCUs to develop critical solutions to meet current and emerging needs.

Youth Access to Sexual Health Services Act: Awards grants to support the access of marginalized youth to sexual health services such as sexual health education and contraception.

Federal FTA Funding for Charlotte Blue Line Extension: \$100 million dollars was appropriated through the omnibus to continue construction on the 9.4 mile LYNX blue line extension in Charlotte.
