Small Business Focus Groups

All business owners of Mecklenburg County are encouraged to participate in focus groups that will be held throughout February and March. The purpose of the focus groups is to assess the needs of the small business community and use this information to improve the website www.CharlotteBusinessResources.com and to inform Economic Development's work. Charlotte Regional Fund for Entrepreneurship (CRFE)

In November 2012 City council adopted a High Growth Entrepreneurship Strategy that poses a goal to attract and retain high growth enterprises and entrepreneurs in Charlotte, attract more venture capital investment into Charlotte based enterprise, and to increase the amount of federal research dollars to our local universities. The CRFE was established as the Charlotte region's public-private partnership to

strengthen the entrepreneurial ecosystem, support increased innovation, improve development of High Growth Entrepreneurship, and increase job creation. Today the CERF is in its second stage of development, which will include engaging the community and forming working groups. Among its accomplishments to this date are mapping of Charlotte's Entrepreneurial Ecosystem, Charlotte Entrepreneurship Growth Report (CEGR), and engaging over 40 entrepreneurs and stakeholders in solution-building for the CEGR findings.

Equitable Economic Development (EED) – Workforce Development

Economic Development Committee presented a report on economic mobility and EED in Charlotte. Current plan goals for Workforce Development include introduction of Partnership for Inclusive Employment and Career Excellence (P.I.E.C.E.) for 2017 – 2021 that will engage 500 adults, youth workforce development aimed at engaging 4,500 youth annually from 31 Charlotte schools, and Focus Area Plan to provide access to job training and employment opportunities for youth and adults. All programs will be catered to needs of and with input from businesses. As of today, 46 individuals enrolled in Project P.I.E.C.E. training, 939 students from 19 high schools received job readiness training in October and November 2016, approximately 65 Charlotte-Mecklenburg Police officers have been trained in mentoring, approximately 486 youth have participated in mock interviews to prepare for summer internships, NewTech Charlotte initiative launched.

Project P.I.E.C.E. (Partners for Inclusive Employment and Career Excellence)

Project P.I.E.C.E. is a workforce development program to address labor market shortages and increase employment opportunities for individuals who may face barriers to employment. The program offers career-related training in residential and commercial construction, highway related construction and broadband training.

The purpose of the program is to heighten the community's awareness of the importance of mentoring, helps connect mentors to mentoring agencies and opportunities, educates mentors about best practices to help create impactful and enduring mentor-mentee relationships, and connect Charlotte's mentoring community.
