FYI, the Citizens Climate Lobby volunteers in Charlotte, NC are working towards legislation that would:

1. Reduce demand for fossil fuels and make alternative, no/low carbon energy sources more affordable!
2. Our Carbon Fee and Dividend policy proposal lets the free market determine the best alternatives for fossil fuels and minimizes the need for government energy subsidies and for any more regulations!
3. It would levy a federal fee on fossil fuels at the source – mines, wells, and ports of entry where ALL revenue would be distributed to U.S. households to offset temporary higher energy costs!
4. There would be a border tariff to discourage businesses from relocating to where they can emit more CO2. This will encourage other nations to adopt equivalent carbon pricing!
5. A revenue Neutral, Carbon Fee and Dividend policy enacted ASAP will save thousands of lives each year from pre-mature deaths, stimulate thousands of new livable wage jobs each year for Charlotteans, and within twenty years cut carbon emissions by 53 percent!
