When doctors finally determined what was wrong with 2-year-old Tristan, it was almost too late. The night he was diagnosed with leukemia, his blood counts were so low, he couldn't receive the transfusions he needed at regular speed for fear of causing his tiny heart to fail. Slowly, over the course of 16 hours, Tristan received four units of blood. He spent 12 more hours receiving three units of platelets.
