On the 2017 general election ballot, Mecklenburg County voters have the opportunity to approve a \$922 million bond referendum for Charlotte-Mecklenburg Schools. The bonds will fund 29 highneed projects to relieve overcrowding, upgrade aging facilities and deliver more academic options for students.

Included in the bond package is \$17.6 million for renovations and upgrades at nationally recognized arts school Northwest School of the Arts. These funds will add much-needed classrooms and replace the aging visual arts building.



Frequently Asked Questions

Q: Voters approved school bonds in 2013. Why does the county need more money now?

A: Charlotte-Mecklenburg Schools plans for its capital needs on a rolling 10-year window. The system updates its capital plan based on enrollment growth, aging facilities and other factors. The 2013 school bonds package is on schedule and the last project will be completed in the summer of 2020. The bonds on this year's ballot are designated for an entirely new and different list of projects that are planned over the next several years.
