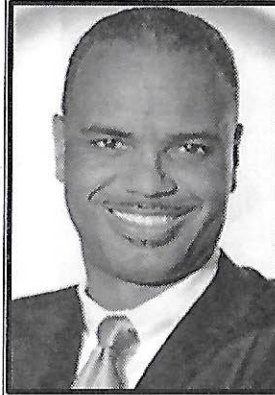

Reverend Robert Scott is a native of Monticello, MS. He is married to Pier Charisse Scott and they are the parents of Charis Jordyn Scott. He preached his initial sermon at age 11; was licensed at age 12; and ordained at age

18 at the Oak Grove Missionary Baptist Church, Monticello, MS.

Dr. Scott graduated with honors from Jackson State Univ. in Jackson, MS (BA in Political Science/Pre-law; from Duke Univ. Divinity School, Durham, NC (M.Div. degree); and from United Theological Seminary, Dayton, OH in 1997 with a doctoral degree at age 29.

Rev. Dr. Scott serves as Necrologist for the Hampton Univ. Ministers Conference, and is on the Board of Trustees for United Theological Seminary, from whom he received the 2016 Distinguished Alumnus Award. He is an active member of Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Inc., receiving the Fraternity's Century of Excellence Award in Religion, and the 2010 International Omega Man of the Year Award. Dr. Scott was inducted into the Morehouse College Board of Preachers (April 2006) and was one of the top 20 young preachers under 40 to watch in the inaugural edition The African American Pulpit (Summer 2001). He has mentored doctoral students and preached extensively across the U.S., and serves on the boards of several prominent organizations. He was a key organizers of "A Call to Oneness," where 20,000+ African American men marched against violence and crime in St. Louis, MO (June 2008).

Dr. Scott has served as pastor of Zion Temple United Church of Christ (Durham, NC); Union Baptist Church (Lexington, NC); and as senior pastor of Central Baptist Church (St. Louis, MO) from Nov. 1999 to Sept. 2016. It is his desire to be a vessel of God and declare to a broken humanity that God the potter wants to put us back together again.

Dr. Kimberly Moore is a native of Abbeville, SC. She is a graduate of Lander Univ. in Greenwood, SC with a B.S. Degree in Business Adm. She received her Masters of Divinity degree in Pastoral Studies and Doctor of Ministry degree in Pastoral Ministries, from Gardner-Webb School of Divinity. She is a member of the Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc.

Dr. Moore's election as the Senior Pastor of Emmanuel Missionary Baptist Church of Gastonia, NC marks a historic event in Gaston County, being the first female to serve as a Senior Pastor in the Gaston County Baptist Assoc. She gives God all the glory for the favor that is upon her life.

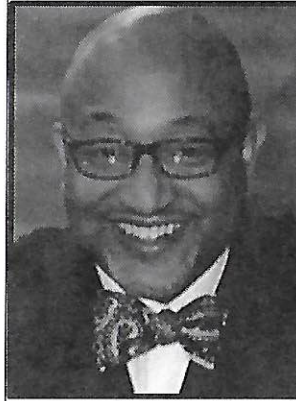
Dr. Moore was licensed to preach the gospel in August 1995 and was ordained in 2001. she was ordained as an Elder in the Lord's church in 2004. She is the founder and CEO of Kimberly Moore Ministries, a non-profit, outreach ministry committed to ministering to and restoring the whole person through Destiny Empowerment Classes, Ministry Mentoring Sessions, and Regional Conferences.

God has truly favored her ministry and caused her name to be spread abroad. She is a highly sought after minister of the Gospel who has been boldly proclaiming the Gospel of Jesus Christ with power and demonstration in church services, conferences and revivals across the U.S. and Internationally.

A native of Muskegon, MI, he received Jesus Christ at age 13, accepted the call to the gospel ministry and was licensed at age 26. He was ordained at St. Paul Missionary Baptist Church in Oxnard, CA in 1995 and served as a Senior Pastor for 16 years in Michigan until God planted him at Greater Mt. Sinai Baptist Church.

Dr. Stewart is a Certified Instructor in the National Baptist Congress of Christian Education, a member of NAACP, Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity Inc., and a participant in the West Boulevard Neighborhood Coalition. He developed an enormous passion for mission work, travelling to Turkey, Asia Minor, Monrovia, Liberia, and to Israel with United Theological Seminary pilgrimage team (2009).

Dr. Stewart earned a Bachelor's (BBA) Degree in Accounting and Finance, from Eastern Michigan Univ., Ypsilanti, MI; a Master of Business Administration (MBA) Degree from California Lutheran University, Thousand Oaks, CA; a Master of Arts (MACE) Degree in Christian Education from the Michigan Theological Seminary, Plymouth, MI; and a Doctor of Ministry (D.Min.) Degree from United Theological Seminary, Dayton, OH. He has also completed the Church Management Certificate program at Villanova University, Villanova, PA.
