On the 2017 general election ballot, Mecklenburg County voters have the opportunity to approve a \$922 million bond referendum for Charlotte-Mecklenburg Schools. The bonds will fund 29 highneed projects to relieve overcrowding, upgrade aging facilities and deliver more academic options for students and families.

**Project Spotlight** 




Included in the 2017 school bonds package is \$283.7 million for nine projects designated for northern Mecklenburg. This includes \$45.4 million to build a new K-8 language immersion magnet on the site of the former J.M. Alexander Middle School in Huntersville. The new 45-classroom school (photo above) opened this past August and was made possible by voter approval of the school bonds in 2013.

In addition to this new middle school, four more new schools will be built in the north including:

- Elementary school to relieve Hidden Valley and Newell elementaries and J.W. Grier Academy
- Facility for exceptional children program on site of former Statesville Road Elementary School
- Replacement school for Bruns Academy
- Replacement school for West Charlotte High School

There are four north-area renovation and expansion projects slated as well. Projects include the second phase of K-8 conversion at Mountain Island Lake Academy with upgrades to its gym and specialty classrooms.

Northern Mecklenburg has received funding for 17 CMS projects with the approval of the last two bond referenda in 2007 and 2013. These projects include Hough High, Ridge Road Middle and Highland Creek Elementary schools to address growth, the previously mentioned replacement school at J.M. Alexander and the Career and Technical Education program at North Mecklenburg High School.



## **Frequently Asked Questions**

Q: What is a bond and how is it used?

**A:** A bond is a way for governments to borrow money at a low interest rate to finance building projects. Mecklenburg County issues bonds to fund new school construction, repairs and renovations for Charlotte-Mecklenburg Schools (CMS) facilities.

Q: Why are bonds on the ballot?

**A:** The lowest interest rates for borrowing money are available by issuing "General Obligation" bonds. State law requires voter approval through a referendum. The Mecklenburg County Board of

Commissioners voted to put the bonds on the ballot at the request of the Charlotte-Mecklenburg Board of Education.

Today is the deadline for voter registration. And, next Thursday, October 19, early voting begins! Check out the **Mecklenburg County Board of Elections** for all the details on early voting including times and locations.

Here's an outline of the election schedule:

October 13: Deadline for voter registration

October 19: First day of early voting

October 31: Last day of absentee voting (by mail)

November 4: Last day of early voting

**November 7:** Election Day
