- 5. Enjoyed the children's story, The Chirkendoose, as performed by the U of M 'Story Troupers"
- 6. Miss Jan Kidder and Dr. Fuminari Natsabuko of Hiroshma Univeristy, Japan, told the story of *Sedako and the Peace Cranes* in Japanese and English while Stuart Jansseen painted Sedako releasing the cranes...
- 7. Created an American flag with the children's handprints and the stars and stripes with them saying aloud, "I believe in peace...." as they imprinted their handprint.
