Social Justice Film: The Road to Brown

You are invited to St. Peter's Social Justice Film night. Please share with your networks and friends.

On Wednesday, October 25 at 6:30 PM, the St. Peter's Social Justice Committee will host a screening of the documentary film *The Road to Brown*. The free screening will take place in the Parish Hall of St. Peter's Episcopal Church, 115 W. 7th St.

The Road to Brown tells the story of the Brown v. Board of Education ruling as the culmination of a brilliant legal assault on segregation that launched the Civil Rights movement. It is also a moving and long overdue tribute to a visionary but little known black lawyer, Charles Hamilton Houston, "the man who killed Jim Crow." The film is 56 minutes long and will be followed by a facilitated discussion led by CMS expert and author, Amy Hawn Nelson, about the film and its relevance to the current state of affairs in the Charlotte Mecklenburg Schools.
