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To the Reading Partners community,

At our core, Reading Partners believes in the awesome potential of all students. We also recognize that many students, such as those who are economically disadvantaged, often face daunting obstacles and we view it as our mission to empower communities to provide support to help ensure all children have the opportunity to become lifelong readers with bright futures. Renowned author and scholar, Dr. Alfred W. Tatum, has observed that establishing meaningful connections to reading can be especially important for vulnerable students, often students of color.

We recently learned that Taylor Hayes, a 7-year-old Reading Partners Baltimore student, was faced with extreme adversity that no child should ever confront when, on July 5, under unclear circumstances, she was struck in the back by a bullet that entered the car she was riding in. For the past two weeks, Taylor has remained in critical condition, valiantly fighting for her life, but I am absolutely heartbroken to share the [devastating news](#) that this precious young girl has passed away. Upon learning about the tragic shooting and Taylor’s precarious condition, the Baltimore community in general, and many people associated with Reading Partners in Baltimore and across the country, have offered financial support and words of encouragement to Taylor and her family as they shouldered the inconceivable burden of the dire threat to the life of this promising young child. Now, in the wake of Taylor’s passing, I would ask you to please hold this special student and her family close in your thoughts. Student success in the 2017-18 school year



Our year-end impact reports are still being finalized and will be posted on our website later this month, but I am so pleased to share preliminary results with you that showcase both the impact we are having in the communities we serve and the incredible achievements of our students across the country.

Program results

- **Nearly 11,000** students served
- **Over 373,000** total tutoring sessions
- **34** sessions per student served (on average)
- **85%** of all students are meeting their primary literacy growth goal
- **90%** of K-2 students are developing mastery of key foundational reading skills needed to read at grade level
- **94%** of principals at Reading Partners schools report school-wide reading progress
- **100%** of teachers report that Reading Partners is valuable to their school
- **95%** of Reading Partners volunteers are satisfied with their experience

Deepen focus on equity

Achieve greater financial sustainability

Achieve greater financial sustainability by increasing nationally driven resource development and pursuing a greater proportion of multi-year, multi-region investments from a broader set of sources.

Ensure organizational success

Ensure organizational success by building the systems, staffing, and infrastructure required to more efficiently and consistently deliver our program.

Reading Partners national board members met in mid-June to discuss program performance and to review and approve our FY19 budget proposal. As I shared with you in my last quarterly update, we have developed a new strategic plan for the organization, and we are using that longer-range plan to help guide our priorities for the year ahead. Key focus areas include strengthening our tutoring model, growing as a champion for educational equity, bolstering our financial sustainability, and strengthening our organizational efficiency and effectiveness. All of our priorities are designed to deepen the already substantial impact Reading Partners is achieving in communities in the 14 regions we support across the country.

Talented new additions to the national board



I want to extend a warm welcome to Kate Jerome and Devin Fletcher, both recent additions to our national Reading Partners board!

After a successful career in education and education publishing, **Kate Jerome** became a prolific author of more than 200 children's books, including books written in collaboration with leading educational and trade publishers like National Geographic, Penguin Random House, and Arcadia Publishing Company. Kate also brings highly valuable expertise in the study of intergenerational connections, an area that is so relevant to one-on-one tutoring. She delivered a compelling [TEDx talk](#) on the subject in 2016 and she has written extensively on the topic as well, including as the creator and program developer for two Read Together/Do Together children's book series

that promote literacy while encouraging meaningful conversations between kids and adults.

Devin Fletcher joined Tulsa Public Schools in 2016 where he currently serves as the chief learning officer (CLO) and chief talent officer (CTO). As the CLO, Devin is responsible for establishing a vision of learning for students and adults in the district and he leads curriculum and instruction, assessment, adult learning, exceptional student support services, language and cultural services, teacher and leader effectiveness, and early childhood education. As the CTO, Devin helped launch Tulsa Teacher Corps, a district-run teacher preparation, and certification program. Previously, Devin served as executive director of teaching and learning at Denver Public Schools from 2013-16 where he was the district lead on academic strategic planning, school-based autonomy, and the implementation of standards-aligned resources and instructional best practices. In his role he spearheaded the design and development of the district's Literacy Plan 2020. Devin has been a true champion for Reading Partners during his time in Denver and now in Tulsa and we are grateful for his ongoing and increasing commitment to our work.
