



Apply to Be a Coach for Girls on the Run or Let Me Run!



Girls on the Run is looking for coaches!

Girls on the Run is a physical activity-based, positive youth development program that inspires girls in 3rd through 8th grade to be joyful, healthy and confident. The ten-week program incorporates running to teach critical life skills, encourage personal development and foster team building and community service.

Did you know? Girls' self-confidence begins to drop by age 9, 50% of girls ages 10 to 13 experience bullying, and physical activity levels decline at age 10.

Girls on the Run Charlotte currently serves about 4,000 girls in Mecklenburg and Cabarrus Counties, with over 50% of them receiving financial assistance to enable their participation in this life-changing program. Volunteers provide critical leadership and the non-profit organization is in need of coaches to facilitate the program with small teams of 8 to 15 girls.

Teams across greater Charlotte, including sites supported by the Charlotte NEXT grant (Albemarle Road Middle School, James Martin Middle School, and Sedgefield

Middle School) meet twice a week for 75-90 minutes and the program culminates with all teams participating in a celebratory 5K event. <u>Girls on the Run Charlotte's</u> Fall Coach Registration is now open and program registration for participants will open on August 20th.

Coaches need not be runners but must complete a background check and attend a training session.

- Thursday, September 6th, 4 pm 8:30 pm
- Saturday, September 15th, 8 am 12 pm
