Governor Vetoes Voter ID, Considers Board of Elections Bill

Charlotte, NC – The Senate adjourned Wednesday, December 19 and is scheduled to reconvene for an unusual skeletal session on Sunday, December 23. Governor Roy Cooper has until Saturday, Dec. 22 to veto the House Bill 1029, Bipartisan State Board Changes. In addition, the Governor has until 11:59 p.m. on Sunday, Dec. 23 to make a decision on Senate Bill 469, Technical Corrections. The General Assembly leaders state the scheduled 1 p.m. sessions are needed to comply with rules that regulate how often the chambers must meet while remaining in session. Bill D'Elia, a spokesman for Senate leader Phil Berger, said in an email "Per the state constitution, the Senate cannot adjourn for more than three days while in session, so we have no choice but to hold a skeletal session on Sunday". Both chambers plan to vote to override Governor Roy Cooper's vetoes on Thursday, Dec. 27 session agenda. "Serving in a position representing the voices of our communities requires flexibility and the rules in place for the General Assembly to meet should provide assurance that we are working for our people," Said Senator Joyce Waddell
