Equal Rights Amendment

Charlotte, NC- Many people traveled from Charlotte to Raleigh by train, buses and cars to join Equal Rights Amendment (ERA) advocates at General Assembly in order to show support for the bill filed, Tuesday March 6. NCGA hosted a press conference where speakers encouraged North Carolina to ratify equal rights under the U.S. Constitution. North Carolina could be the 38th and last state expected to ensure that sex-based discrimination is prohibited by government through statutes, regulations, employment and law enforcement.

Members of the House and Senate wore white and green to stand in support of filing the Equal Rights Amendment. Senate Bill 184, NC Adopt Equal Rights Amendment, would achieve:

- Equality of rights under the law shall not be denied or abridged by the United States or by any state on account of sex.
- Congress shall have the power to enforce, by appropriate legislation, the provisions of this article.
- And the amendment shall take effect two years after the date of ratification.

Senate Bill 184 would be introduced for the fifth year at the NCGA session as similar bills did not pass committee meeting. Senator Joyce Waddell is a co-sponsor of Senate Bill 184. The deadlines to request and file for the 2019 legislative session is quickly approaching. The last date to request Public Bills and Resolutions is Wednesday, March 13 and the final day to file in the Senate is Tuesday, April 2. Thursday, March 14 is the deadline to file local bills in the Senate.
