The Joint Appropriations meetings will be wrapping up for the session and the House Appropriations Committee Chairs will soon begin laying out their funding priorities with their committee members. Speaker of the House Tim Moore (R-Cleveland) has indicated that the House budget should be released by the end of April.

## County Announces Plans for U.S. Census 2020

Census Day 2020 is one year away, and work has begun locally in preparation of this national initiative. Mecklenburg County and the NC Counts Coalition announced during a press conference at the Charlotte-Mecklenburg Government Center today Meck Counts 2020, an effort to plan outreach and engagement for the U.S. 2020 Census.

The announcement featured information on the establishment of a 2020 Census Complete Count Committee, which is comprised of elected officials and leaders from education, business, nonprofit, healthcare, the faith community and community based-organizations. They will work with local stakeholders and media to educate the public about Census 2020, encourage participation, and facilitate survey access, particularly among traditionally hard-to-count populations.

Speakers also discussed the 5,000 Census jobs that will be available in North Carolina; 1,800 of which will be in Mecklenburg County. These temporary jobs will include census takers, recruiting assistants, office staff and supervisory staff.
