

HB 370, also known as the "Show Me Your Papers" Law would require sheriff deputies to ask people about their immigration status regardless of criminal charge and require sheriff deputies to report and detain individuals for ICE. Deputies would have to report the presence of undocumented people to ICE, hand them over to ICE, and comply with any ICE request accompanied by a detainer or ICE hold, which under federal law are voluntary administrative requests and are not the same as criminal judicial warrants. Sign the petition to tell Gov. Cooper to veto this bill!
