The Local Initiatives Support Corporation (LISC) will leverage funding from the private sector and national sources for a wide range of community investment efforts, focused on ways to create economic opportunity in all Charlotte neighborhoods.

LISC's first program action is to provide a \$25,000 capacity-building grant to Historic West End Partners, a nonprofit that has worked since 2010 to raise up the culture, history and quality of life in northwest Charlotte.
