Congratulations to our Information Technology Services (ITS) Department on receiving a 2019 Blue Diamond Award. The team received the award for their development of a new system for the County's Community Resource Center (CRC). ITS partnered with the Enterprise Project Management Office, Health & Human Services (HHS) and Microsoft to build the system using Microsoft Dynamics/CRM in the cloud.

The CRC program provides a pleasant, efficient experience to the hundreds of customers who visit the center each day. Customers can access a multitude of County services under one roof at the CRC. Previously, HHS agencies were housed in separate locations around the County, where technology systems did not provide the modern experience that is now available at the CRC. The system was implemented and went live in June 2018 and has serviced over 85,000 visitors.

ITS staff recently accepted the award at the Charlotte Area Technology Collaborative Awards Ceremony. The Blue Diamond Awards has been Charlotte's leading annual technology awards celebration for over 20 years. This event recognizes the area's top technology solutions, programs and innovations.
