Since our founding in the region in January of 2016, Reading Partners Charlotte has served 738 students and partnered with six CMS elementary schools and one charter school. At the end of the 2017-18 school year, 91 percent of our students were meeting or exceeding their primary end-ofyear literacy growth goals. While this year's student performance results are not yet finalized, our students have once again made tremendous gains since the beginning of the year and are on the path to becoming confident, proficient, lifelong readers.
