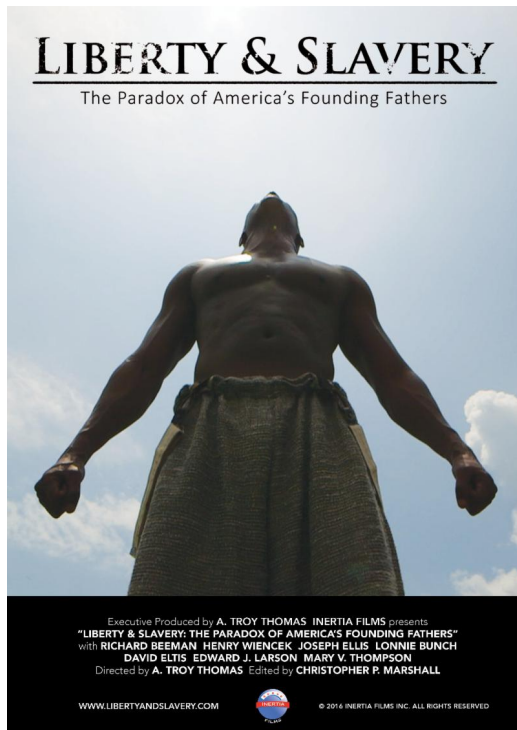


Summer Lecture Series:
