Diversity is one of the most pressing issues facing journalism. Despite the tireless advocacy of many in the industry, institutional efforts to solve failures in diversity have been ineffective or nonexistent.

If news outlets are to survive, they must engage new, younger and more diverse audiences. Organizations and their leaders must make a commitment to change their institutional cultures and address systemic issues.

Today, to help drive this change, Knight Foundation announced a \$1.2 million investment in the Maynard Institute and its new Equity and Inclusion Transformation Program. The program will embed specialists in news organizations to assess internal processes; analyze cultural dynamics; and help them become more inclusive, equitable workplaces that reflect and adequately cover the communities they serve.
