

Agriculture and Consumer Services as reimbursement for composting programs to the Hurricane Florence Disaster Recovery Fund. About \$2 million will be allocated for a pilot program providing flood insurance for low-income households.

- Senate Bill 458: PTS Day/Cardiac Task Force/Titus's Law/Data. The Proposed Committee Substitute (PCS) to Senate Bill 458 would designate June 27 of each year as Post-traumatic Stress Injury Awareness Day in North Carolina; establish the Joint Legislative Task Force on Sudden Cardiac Arrest in Student Athletes (Task Force); address parental consent and the disposition of fetal remains; and authorize engagement with third party toxicology laboratories to guide resources.
- Senate Bill 691: Emergency Operating Funds for Utilities an act to modify the implementation of the North Carolina read to achieve program in order to attain statewide reading proficiency by the third grade. Senate voted 68-48 to pass the bill. Governor Cooper vetoed this bill on August 23, 2019.
- <u>Senate Bill 692: 2019 Senate Consensus Nonpartisan Map</u> would call for a change to the NC Constitution that would create an independent citizens redistricting commission to handle future redistricting.
