Park and Recreation Receives Reaccreditation

[Mecklenburg County Park and Recreation](#) has been reaccredited by the Accreditation of Park and Recreation Agencies (CAPRA). This cycle marks its second successful bid for reaccreditation since its initial accreditation in 2012.

Of the more than 12,000 Park and Recreation agencies in the United States, Mecklenburg County was one of only 100 to receive this prestigious honor. Department staff worked collaboratively to demonstrate compliance with more than 150 standards on issues ranging from human resources to program quality.

CAPRA Commission visitors made a site visit to Mecklenburg County in August and received its official 5-year reaccreditation last week at the National Recreation Association Conference in Baltimore.

Economic Development to Launch Small Business Loan Program

Next Monday, Oct. 7 at 10 a.m., the County's [Office of Economic Development](#) will launch its Small Business Loan Program. The event will be held at the County Administration Center.

Pegram St., Charlotte. This new program was created to help businesses that meets their needs. Loans of up to \$75,000 will be available to qualified businesses through our partnership with the Carolina Small Business Loan Fund. The County will be an active partner by playing a role in all phases of the application and loan process.

Businesses that apply must be located in Mecklenburg County and have annual revenue of less than \$1 million. Applicants should not have any open tax liens, unpaid judgments or bankruptcy in the past five years. Additional details on the program guidelines will be provided at the kickoff event.

Community Support Services Releases Annual Report on Housing

Last week, [Community Support Services](#) (CSS) released the "[2019 Community Support Services Housing Instability and Homelessness Report](#)," which provides the county's annual report on housing and homelessness.

This is the only community housing document that combines all data on housing across the entire local housing continuum. The 2019 report has three important findings: expanded data on the rental mismatch in Mecklenburg; the release of data that accurately depicts how many people are experiencing homelessness; and a list of rental units with expiring federal subsidies.

The report is funded by Community Support Services and produced by the Housing Institute.
