Hello My Friends,

This is Brenda Robinson, and some of you know me as the First African American Female Pilot in US Navy History and Retired American Airlines Wide Body Aircraft Pilot. After retiring from American Airlines, I naturally wanted to afford all young people the opportunity to learn why I found aviation so fascinating, and offer the inspiration and enthusiasm that was given to me as a young girl. So, in 2014, I founded the Aviation Camps of the Carolinas. And in 2016 I was able to make it a non profit 501C3 allowing me a means to reach all students. Just so you know, the aviation industry is experiencing a critical shortage in every job description.

My goal today is to continue to inspire 9 to 17year old students to pursue an aviation dream, not only per say becoming a Pilot, but give them a behind the scenes introduction to all airline industry opportunities available to them. But that's not all. During the camp, I give them the confidence that **they** can do this, and the Mentors that will help make their dreams come true along with consistent dedicated focus. The students will tell you I said hard work. And I will let them believe that. We incorporate all aspects of STEM Programs in the aviation community, and we are also certified to give Boy/Girl Scouts the opportunity to complete their Aviation Merit Badge.

To date, my camps have been a huge success with gracious sponsors like you. Our region's camps are at four Carolina Airports and expanding. Look for us at the Charlotte Douglas International Airport, Concord Regional Airport, Monroe Executive Airport, and Rock Hill-York County airport. I conduct single day camps 4 times yearly in the Spring, early Summer, Fall, and Winter.

That is now where I need your help to continue giving our young adults the basis for success. Some students are able to afford the cost of the camp, but many cannot. Some students are excited about aviation; some students do not know it is "a thing!" My purpose is to engage all open minded students in my camp. The future of my 501C3 camp's success is based upon individuals like you or corporations becoming sponsors.
