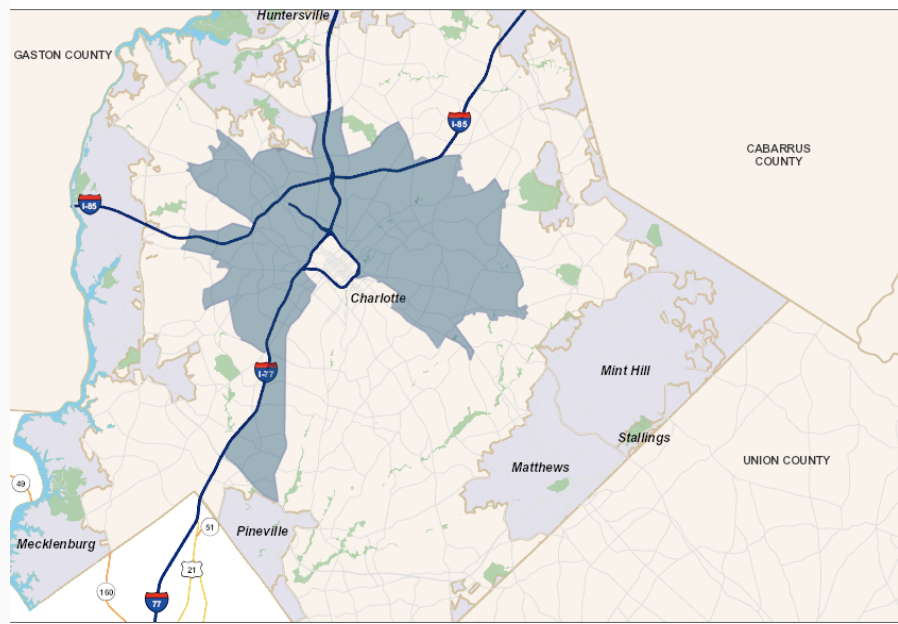

Micro businesses can apply for relief funds

Starting Monday, Charlotte's micro businesses -- those with five or fewer employees -- can apply for grants to combat the economic disruption caused by the coronavirus pandemic.

The city has partnered with Local Initiatives Support Corporation (LISC) to deploy the Micro Business Relief Fund, where 100 micro businesses -- located within opportunity corridors that fall largely on the east and west sides of town -- could receive up to \$10,000 each. The cash can be used for operational costs such as payroll, vendors, utilities and rent. Applications open Monday at noon.

A city official tells QCity Metro that, because the grant program will draw a large number of submissions, applications will be judged using strict standards.
