


**Mildred Grier, a West End neighbor you should know** Mildred Grier celebrated her 97<sup>th</sup> birthday this month. The Charlotte native grew up in the city's Third Ward, near what is now Panthers Stadium.

She's now a resident of McCrory Heights.

Grier was among the first women admitted as freshmen to Johnson C. Smith University. Years later, she and her late husband, Joe, were among the first to buy property in McCrory Heights, then a up-and-coming suburb for Black professionals.

Micro businesses can apply for relief funds

Starting Monday, Charlotte's micro businesses -- those with five or fewer employees -- can apply for grants to combat the economic disruption caused by the coronavirus pandemic.

The city has partnered with Local Initiatives Support Corporation (LISC) to deploy the Micro Business Relief Fund, where 100 micro businesses -located within opportunity corridors that fall largely on the east and west sides of town -- could receive up to \$10,000 each. The cash can be used for operational costs such as payroll, vendors, utilities and rent. Applications open Monday at noon.

A city official tells QCity Metro that, because the grant program will draw a large number of submissions, applications will be judged using strict standards.

The project has been held up by a number of factors, including work on the Hawthorn Lane Bridge, on the other end of the streetcar line, in the Elizabeth neighborhood.
