

Charlotte - Today, **Congresswoman Alma Adams (NC-12)** hosted a reception honoring the winners of the Congressional Art Competition in North Carolina's 12th Congressional District.

On the call, **Adams**, a former art professor at Bennett College and member of the Congressional Arts Caucus, announced the winners of the 2020 Congressional art competition.

During the reception, **22 pieces of artwork** submitted by high school students in North Carolina's 12th Congressional District were displayed and judged by three local artists: **Gordon James, Al Foster, and A.J. Foster.**

"As an artist and former art professor, I share these students' passion for expression through art," **said Congresswoman Adams.** "The student artists in North Carolina's 12th Congressional District are tremendously talented and I'm proud of the young people who submitted their artwork for the competition. I look forward to hosting this year's winner, **Francis Genco**, in D.C. and seeing his artwork, entitled "Working Man", exhibited in the U.S. Capitol.

The first place winner won tickets to D.C. for the nationwide Congressional art competition reception. Their art, along with other high school students across the country, will be displayed in the U.S. Capitol for one year. The second and third place entries will be on display for one year in Congresswoman Adams' D.C. office and the two entries that received honorable mentions will be displayed in her district office.

The U.S. House of Representatives hosts a Congressional art competition each year as an opportunity to recognize and encourage artistic talent in the country. Gordon James is a professional illustrator and award-winning fine artist. He has worked as a full-time illustrator for Hallmark Cards, Inc. and is a recipient of a Caldecott medal. Mr. James is also a children's book illustrator and his illustrations have recently been published in the children's book "Let 'Er Buck".

Al and A.J. Foster are art collectors and own their own small business called "Fosters Frames and Art Gallery" in Huntersville, North Carolina. Mr. and Mrs. Foster provide framing for art pieces and have a beautiful gallery that showcases original art and limited edition prints that allow local and national artists the chance to demonstrate their skills.

Congresswoman Alma Adams represents North Carolina's 12th Congressional District (Charlotte) and serves as Vice Chair of the House Committee on Agriculture. Additionally, she serves on the House Financial Services Committee and the House Education & Labor Committee, where she serves as Chair of the Workforce Protections Subcommittee.
